Need boxes for your project?

Alan Meinholdt makes both standard sized and smaller boxes. Check out the info below!

The standard Geology Display box size is 18" X 24" X 4". All display boxes come with a Plexiglass cover. Standard Pine wood is \$55.00 – There is no clear finish on Pine boxes.

All other woods for a standard box are \$65.00 each, and have a clear finish. Walnut, Oak (White or Red) are the most common. Other varieties will depend on what is available at the sawmill. Examples include Elm, Cedar, Sycamore, Locust, Hackberry, Hickory, Ash

Also available for the Special Educational Displays for Geology are smaller display boxes. These displays can be made to order and come with a Plexiglass cover and a clear finish. Prices depend on size and what varieties of wood are available at the time.
